Biblical Doctrine is ...

- Doctrine is teaching, instruction.
- Biblical doctrine is the written instruction of the Bible that defines biblical Christianity.
- The Bible is to be understood in the context of history, society and culture but never altered by or bound to these things.

Antithetic Parallelism

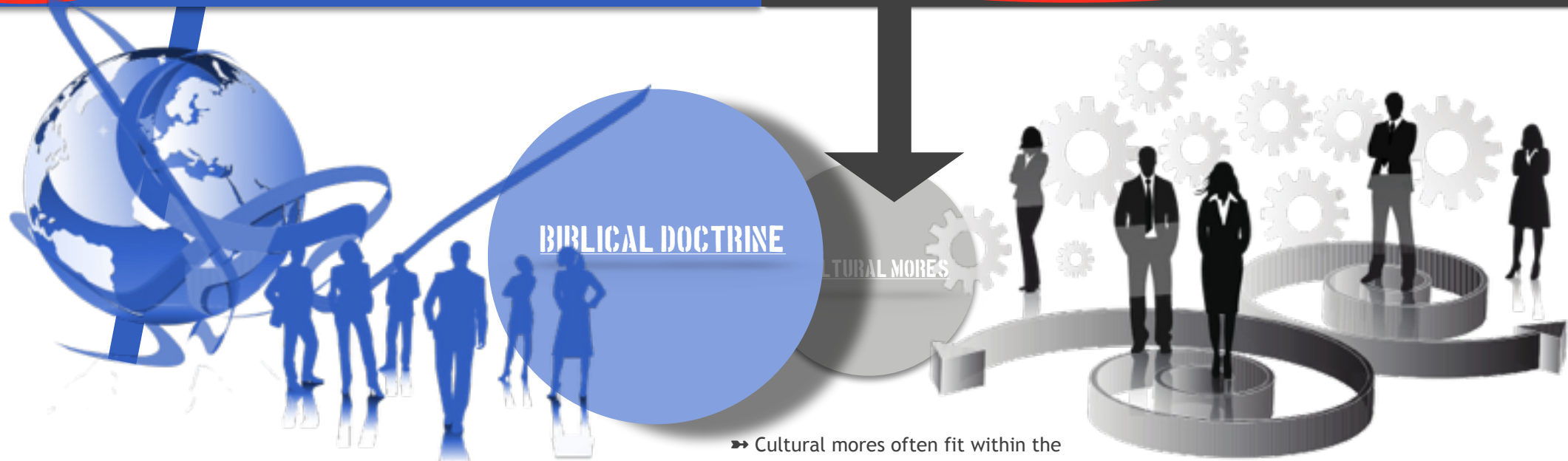
- **Antithetic parallelism:** Gives opposite ideas or contrasts.
- Synthetic parallelism: Adds to or amplifies.
- Synonymous parallelism: Repeats approximately the same thought contained in the earlier line.

Mores are ...

- Pronounce "mores": mawr-eyz, mohr-eyz.
- The unspoken but understood norms of a community or society; the customs, norms, and behaviors that are acceptable to a society or social group; essential or characteristic customs and conventions of a society or community; the fixed morally binding customs of a particular group.
