The words of the Amen,

the faithful and true witness, the beginning of God's creation ...

- (John 1:51) And he said to him, "Truly, truly [Amen, amen], I say to you, you will see heaven opened, and the angels of God ascending and descending on the Son of Man."
- (John 5:24) Truly, truly **[Amen, amen]**, I say to you, whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life. He does not come into judgment, but has passed from death to life.
- (John 5:25) Truly, truly **[Amen, amen]**, I say to you, an hour is coming, and is now here, when the dead will hear the voice of the Son of God, and those who hear will live.
- (John 6:47) Truly, truly **[Amen, amen]**, I say to you, whoever believes has eternal life.
- (John 8:51) Truly, truly [Amen, amen], I say to you, if anyone keeps my word, he will never see death.
- (John 8:58) Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly [Amen, amen], I say to you, before Abraham was, I am."
- (John 12:24) Truly, truly **[Amen, amen]**, I say to you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains alone; but if it dies, it bears much fruit.
- (John 14:12) Truly, truly **[Amen, amen]**, I say to you, whoever believes in me will also do the works that I do; and greater works than these will he do, because I am going to the Father.
- (Romans 11:36) For from him and through him and to him are all things. To him be glory forever. **Amen.**
- (Romans 16:27) To the only wise God be glory forevermore through Jesus Christ! **Amen.**
- (Ephesians 3:21) To him be glory in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever. **Amen.**
- \bullet (Philippians 4:20) To our God and Father be glory forever and ever. $\boldsymbol{Amen.}$
- (1 Timothy 1:17) To the King of the ages, immortal, invisible, the only God, be honor and glory forever and ever. **Amen.**
- (Jude 25) To the only God, our Savior, through Jesus Christ our Lord, be glory, majesty, dominion, and authority, before all time and now and forever. **Amen.**

^{*}Our familiar word "amen" is a transliteration of the Greek word "ἀμὴν" which means "firm, sure or truly ... an expression of absolute trust and confidence" [Strong, J. (1995). Enhanced Strong's Lexicon. Woodside Bible Fellowship].

When we read "verily, verily" or "truly, truly" in our English Bibles, this is literally "amen, amen" as demonstrated above in the gospel of John. When the actual word "amen" is used in our English Bibles, it is this exact word transliterated almost without exception.
