



## SAVED BY GRACE

### By Grace You Have Been Saved ...

### This is not your own doing ...

- (Ephesians 2:1–10 ESV) And you were dead in the trespasses and sins <sup>2</sup> in which you once walked, following the course of this world, following the prince of the power of the air, the spirit that is now at work in the sons of disobedience— <sup>3</sup> among whom we all once lived in the passions of our flesh, carrying out the desires of the body and the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, like the rest of mankind. <sup>4</sup> But God, being rich in mercy, because of the great love with which he loved us, <sup>5</sup> **even when we were dead in our trespasses, made us alive together with Christ—by grace you have been saved**— <sup>6</sup> and raised us up with him and seated us with him in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, <sup>7</sup> so that in the coming ages he might show the immeasurable riches of his grace in kindness toward us in Christ Jesus. <sup>8</sup> **For by grace you have been saved through faith. And this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, <sup>9</sup> not a result of works, so that no one may boast.** <sup>10</sup> For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them.

- (John 1:14 ESV) And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen his glory, glory as of the only Son from the Father, **full of grace and truth.**
- (John 1:16–18 ESV) For from his fullness we have all received, **grace upon grace.** <sup>17</sup> For the law was given through Moses; **grace and truth came through Jesus Christ.** <sup>18</sup> No one has ever seen God; the only God, who is at the Father's side, he has made him known.
- (Acts 4:33 ESV) And with great power the apostles were giving their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, **and great grace was upon them all.**
- (Acts 13:43 ESV) And after the meeting of the synagogue broke up, many Jews and devout converts to Judaism followed Paul and Barnabas, who, as they spoke with them, urged them to **continue in the grace of God.**
- (Acts 15:11 ESV) But **we believe that we will be saved through the grace of the Lord Jesus,** just as they will.
- (Acts 18:27–28 ESV) And when he wished to cross to Achaia, the brothers encouraged him and wrote to the disciples to welcome him. When he arrived, he greatly **helped those who through grace had believed,** <sup>28</sup> for he powerfully refuted the Jews in public, showing by the Scriptures that the Christ was Jesus.
- (Acts 20:24 ESV) But I do not account my life of any value nor as precious to myself, if only I may finish my course and the ministry that I received from the Lord Jesus, **to testify to the gospel of the grace of God.**
- (Acts 20:32 ESV) And now I commend you to God and **to the word of his grace,** which is able to build you up and to give you the inheritance among all those who are sanctified.
- (Romans 3:21–25 ESV) But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it— <sup>22</sup> the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction: <sup>23</sup> for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, <sup>24</sup> and are **justified by his grace as a gift,** through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, <sup>25</sup> whom God put forward as a propitiation by his blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins.
- (Romans 4:16 ESV) That is why it depends on faith, in order **that the promise may rest on grace** and be guaranteed to all his offspring—not only to the adherent of the law but also to the one who shares the faith of Abraham, who is the father of us all,
- (Romans 5:1–2 ESV) Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with God

through our Lord Jesus Christ. 2 Through him we have also obtained access by faith into **this grace in which we stand**, and we rejoice in hope of the glory of God.

- (Romans 5:15–17 ESV) But the free gift is not like the trespass. For if many died through one man's trespass, **much more have the grace of God and the free gift by the grace** of that one man Jesus Christ abounded for many. 16 And the free gift is not like the result of that one man's sin. For the judgment following one trespass brought condemnation, but the free gift following many trespasses brought justification. 17 For if, because of one man's trespass, death reigned through that one man, much more will **those who receive the abundance of grace and the free gift of righteousness** reign in life through the one man Jesus Christ.
- (Romans 6:14 ESV) For sin will have no dominion over you, since **you are not under law but under grace**.
- (Romans 11:5–6 ESV) So too at the present time there is a remnant, **chosen by grace**. 6 **But if it is by grace, it is no longer on the basis of works; otherwise grace would no longer be grace**.
- (1 Corinthians 15:10 ESV) But **by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace toward me was not in vain**. On the contrary, I worked harder than any of them, though it was not I, but **the grace of God that is with me**.
- (2 Corinthians 8:9 ESV) For you know **the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ**, that though he was rich, yet for your sake he became poor, so that you by his poverty might become rich.
- (Galatians 2:21 ESV) I **do not nullify the grace of God**, for if righteousness were through the law, then Christ died for no purpose.
- (Ephesians 1:7 ESV) In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, **according to the riches of his grace**.
- (Ephesians 4:29 ESV) Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, **that it may give grace to those who hear**.
- (Philippians 1:7 ESV) It is right for me to feel this way about you all, because I hold you in my heart, for you are all **partakers with me of grace**, both in my imprisonment and in the defense and confirmation of the gospel.
- (Colossians 1:5–7 ESV) Because of the hope laid up for you in heaven. Of this you have heard before in the word of the truth, the gospel, 6

which has come to you, as indeed in the whole world it is bearing fruit and increasing—as it also does among you, **since the day you heard it and understood the grace of God in truth**, 7 just as you learned it from Epaphras our beloved fellow servant. He is a faithful minister of Christ on your behalf.

- (1 Timothy 1:13–14 ESV) Though formerly I was a blasphemer, persecutor, and insolent opponent. But I received mercy because I had acted ignorantly in unbelief, 14 **and the grace of our Lord overflowed for me with the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus**.
- (2 Timothy 1:8–9 ESV) Therefore do not be ashamed of the testimony about our Lord, nor of me his prisoner, but share in suffering for the gospel by the power of God, 9 who saved us and called us to a holy calling, **not because of our works but because of his own purpose and grace**, which he gave us in Christ Jesus before the ages began.
- (Titus 3:4–7 ESV) But when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, 5 he saved us, **not because of works done by us** in righteousness, but according to his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, 6 whom he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, 7 **so that being justified by his grace we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life**.
- (1 Peter 1:10 ESV) Concerning this salvation, **the prophets who prophesied about the grace that was to be yours** searched and inquired carefully.
- (1 Peter 1:13 ESV) Therefore, preparing your minds for action, and being sober-minded, **set your hope fully on the grace that will be brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ**.
- (2 Peter 1:2 ESV) **May grace and peace be multiplied to you in the knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord**.
- (2 Peter 3:18 ESV) **But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ**. To him be the glory both now and to the day of eternity. Amen.
- (Jude 3–4 ESV) Beloved, although I was very eager to write to you about our common salvation, I found it necessary to write appealing to you to contend for the faith that was once for all delivered to the saints. 4 For certain people have crept in unnoticed who long ago were designated for this condemnation, **ungodly people, who pervert the grace of our God into sensuality and deny our only Master and Lord, Jesus Christ**.
