## You Are My Hiding Place A Study on Forgiveness in Psalm 32



- David rejoices in the blessing of God's forgiveness, 32:1-2.
  - (Psalm 32:1–2 NIV) Blessed is the one whose transgressions are forgiven, whose sins are covered. 2 Blessed is the one whose sin the LORD does not count against them and in whose spirit is no deceit.
    - a. David rejoices that his transgressions-his rebellious ways-against God and his authority are forgiven.
    - b. David rejoices that his sins are covered-that God covers his sins when he falls short of God's righteous ways.
    - c. David rejoices that the LORD does not count his iniquity against him-his corrupting and twisting of God's righteous standards.
    - d. David rejoices that he now can live in complete honesty before the LORD.
- II. Paul sheds New Testament light on the blessing of forgiveness in which David rejoiced, Romans 4:1-8.
  - (Romans 4:1-8 ESV) What then shall we say was gained by Abraham, our forefather according to the flesh? 2 For if Abraham was justified by works, he has something

to boast about, but not before God. 3 For what does the Scripture say? "Abraham believed God, and it was counted to him as righteousness." 4 Now to the one who works, his wages are not counted as a gift but as his due. 5 And to the one who does not work but believes in him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is counted as righteousness, 6 just as David also speaks of the blessing of the one to whom God counts righteousness apart from works: 7 "Blessed are those whose lawless deeds are forgiven, and whose sins are covered; 8 blessed is the man against whom the Lord will not count his sin."

- a. The blessing of forgiveness is a matter of righteousness and cannot be gained by selfeffort, 4:1-2.
- b. The blessing of forgiveness is a matter of righteousness which is credited to the account of the one who believes, 4:3.
- c. If you work for this blessing, then you will receive your due, 4:4.
- d. If you do not work but believe God for the blessing, then righteousness will be put to your account, 4:5.
- e. Example and Summary: This blessing is the blessing of David in Psalm 32, 4:6-8.

## III. David testifies to the work of the heavy hand of God in bringing him to the place of true forgiveness, 32:3-5.

- (Psalm 32:3–5 NIV) When I kept silent, my bones wasted away through my groaning all day long. 4 For day and night your hand was heavy on me; my strength was sapped as in the heat of summer. 5 Then I acknowledged my sin to you and did not cover up my iniquity. I said, "I will confess my transgressions to the LORD." And you forgave the guilt of my sin.
  - a. David kept silent before God regarding his sin and suffered the consequences of the heavy hand of God, 32:3-4.
  - b. David did three things in breaking his silence and confessing his sin, 32:5.
    - He acknowledged his sin—that he had fallen short of God's righteous ways.
    - ii. He did not cover his iniquity—his corrupted and twisted way of life.
    - iii. He confessed his rebellious ways.
  - c. God forgave the quilt of his sin.
- IV. David urges the faithful to pray and hide in the LORD for protection when trouble comes, 32:6-7.
  - (Psalm 32:6–7 NIV) Therefore let all the faithful pray to you while you may be found; surely the rising of the mighty waters will not reach them. 7 You are my hiding place; you will protect me from trouble and surround me with songs of deliverance.

No longer hiding **from** the LORD but now hiding **in** the LORD.

- V. God offers us instruction and loving counsel in the way we should go, 32:8.
  - (Psalm 32:8 NIV) I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go; I will counsel you with my loving eye on you.
- VI. God warns us to have understanding and not be stubborn like a mule, 32:9.
  - (Psalm 32:9 NIV) Do not be like the horse or the mule, which have no understanding but must be controlled by bit and bridle or they will not come to you.
- VII. David contrasts the woes of the wicked with the unfailing love of God that surrounds the one who trusts in him, 32:10.
  - (Psalm 32:10 NIV) Many are the woes of the wicked, but the LORD's unfailing love surrounds the one who trusts in him.
- VIII. David gathers his thoughts and calls us to rejoice in the LORD, 32:11.
  - (Psalm 32:11 NIV) Rejoice in the LORD and be glad, you righteous; sing, all you who are upright in heart!
  - (Psalm 32:11 NLT) So rejoice in the Lord and be glad, all you who obey him! Shout for joy, all you whose hearts are pure!
