

THEREFORE WE WILL **NOT** FEAR

1. God is our refuge and strength, 46:1-3.

• (Psalm 46:1–3 LSB) God is our refuge and strength, A very present help in trouble. 2 Therefore we will not fear, though the earth should change And though the mountains shake into the heart of the sea; 3 Though its waters roar and foam, Though the mountains quake at its lofty pride. Selah.

a. Statement of fact #1: God is ...

• (Genesis 1:1 LSB) In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.

b. Statement of fact #2: God is our ...

Qur – the first person plural possessive determiner; it means belonging to or associated with the speaker and one or more other people previously mentioned or easily identified; belonging to or connected with you and the group that you are a part of.

<u>Our</u> – in this text identifies the people of God; those who have put their faith in God and have received forgiveness of sins and the gift of eternal life.

c. Statement of fact #3: God is our refuge and strength.

Refuge – something or someone turned to for assistance or security. It is refuge and shelter from rain or storm, from danger; from falsehood.

<u>Strength</u> – the property of being physically or mentally strong. It signifies might, strength; material or physical; personal or social or political.

d. <u>Statement of fact #4</u>: God is a well proved, present help in times of trouble.

<u>Help</u> – to give or provide what is necessary to accomplish a task or satisfy a need.

<u>Trouble</u> – an event causing distress, pain, anguish.

- (Psalm 145:18 LSB) Yahweh is near to all who call upon Him, To all who call upon Him in truth.
- (Genesis 15:1 LSB) After these things the word of Yahweh came to Abram in a vision, saying, "Do not fear, Abram, I am a shield to you; Your reward shall be very great."
- (Deuteronomy 31:8 LSB) And Yahweh is the one who goes ahead of you; He will be with you. <u>He will not fail you or forsake you</u>. <u>Do not fear or be dismayed</u>.
- (Isaiah 41:10 LSB) <u>Do not fear, for I am with you</u>; <u>Do not anxiously look about you</u>, <u>for I am your God</u>. I will make you mighty, <u>surely I will help you</u>; <u>Surely I will uphold you with My righteous right hand</u>.

- (Psalm 78:52–54b LSB) <u>But He led forth Hisomy people like sheep And guided them in the wilderness like a flock;</u> 53 He led them safely, <u>so that they did not fear</u>; But the sea covered their enemies. 54 So He brought them to His holy land.
- e. Therefore ... we will not fear.
- f. <u>Even if</u> ... cataclysmic events change the earth and our lives, we will not fear.

Excursus: How do we get to ... "Therefore we will not fear"

We need to answer three questions: What is fear? What causes fear? How do we not fear?

I. What is fear?

<u>Definition</u>: Fear is an unpleasant often strong emotion caused by anticipation of, or awareness of, danger; a distressing emotion aroused by impending danger, evil, pain, etc., whether the threat is real or imagined; a feeling of disquiet or apprehension.

A very basic working definition: Fear is a distressing emotion precipitated by a person anticipating life events or circumstances not turning out in the good way in which he or she had planned or hoped.

Fear... Heb. yaw-ray and means to fear, be afraid; also speaks of reverence, astonishment, awe; be held in awe.

Fear... Gk. φοβέω [phobeo] and means to put to flight by terrifying; to scare away, be afraid; seized with alarm; struck with amazement; to reverence, venerate.

II. What is the primary, underlying cause of fear?

- a. A broken relationship with our Creator is the most basic, underlying cause of all our fears.
- b. Adam is our example—he broke his relationship with his Creator when he disobeyed his command.
- c. His relationship with his Creator instantly changed from life to death and from fellowship to fear
- d. So the next time God came to visit, he found Adam hiding behind the trees.
 - (Genesis 3:7–10 LSB) And the eyes of both of them were opened, and they knew

that they were naked; and they sewed fig leaves together and made themselves loin coverings. 8 Then they heard the sound of Yahweh God walking in the garden in the cool of the day, and the man and his wife hid themselves from the presence of Yahweh God in the midst of the trees of the garden. 9 Yahweh God called to the man and said to him, "Where are you?" 10 And he said, "I heard the sound of You in the garden, and I was afraid because I was naked; so I hid."

- e. Adam and Eve lost the glory of their relationship with God and were now naked and afraid.
 - (Psalm 8:5 ESV) Yet you have made him a little lower than the heavenly beings and crowned him with glory and honor.
 - (Hebrews 4:13 ESV) And no creature is hidden from his sight, <u>but all are naked and</u> <u>exposed to the eyes of him to whom we must give</u> account.

III. The antidote—How do I not fear?

- a. Accept and live by God's plan for my life.
- b. Know scripturally and experientially that God will work out his plan for my life for good.
 - (Romans 8:28 LSB) And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to His purpose.
- Know scripturally and experientially that God's plan for my life will far exceed any plan I could ever come up with.
 - (1 Corinthians 2:9 ESV) But, as it is written, "What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the heart of man imagined, what God has prepared for those who love him"—
- d. Know scripturally and experientially that God saves me completely, perfectly and forever.
 - (Hebrews 7:25 AMP) Therefore He is able also to save to the uttermost (completely, perfectly, finally, and for all time and eternity) those who come to God through Him, since He is always living to make petition to God and intercede with Him and intervene for them.

2. The holy places of God will not be shaken, 46:4-7.

- (Psalm 46:4–7 LSB) There is a river whose streams make glad the city of God, The holy dwelling places of the Most High. 5 God is in the midst of her, she will not be shaken; God will help her when morning dawns. 6 The nations roar, the kingdoms shake; He gives His voice, the earth melts. 7 Yahweh of hosts is with us; The God of Jacob is our stronghold. Selah.
- a. Our eternal destiny as believers in Jesus Christ is the glad city of God—Jerusalem.
 - (Revelation 21:1–2 LSB) Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth; for the first heaven and the first earth passed away, and there is no longer any sea. 2
 And I saw the holy city, new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, made ready as a bride adorned for her husband.
 - (Philippians 3:20 LSB) For our citizenship is in heaven, from which also we eagerly wait for a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ.
- b. God prepared a city for our eternal home.
 - (Hebrews 11:10 LSB) For [Abraham] was looking for the city which has foundations, whose architect and builder is God.
 - (Hebrews 11:16 LSB) But now, they aspire to a better country, that is, a heavenly one.

 Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God, for He prepared a city for them.
- We will live in the city God prepared for us in the holy places of God and will never be shaken but remain forever.
 - (Hebrews 12:26–29 LSB) And His voice shook the earth then, but now He has promised, saying, "YET ONCE MORE I WILL SHAKE NOT ONLY THE EARTH, BUT ALSO THE HEAVEN." 27 Now this expression, "Yet once more," indicates the removing of those things which can be shaken, as of created things, so that those things which cannot be shaken may remain. 28 Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom which cannot be shaken, let us show gratitude, by which we may offer to God an acceptable service with reverence and awe; 29 for OUR GOD IS A CONSUMING FIRE.

- 3. So God says ... be still, drop the worry and know that he is God, 46:8-11.
 - (Psalm 46:8–11 LSB) Come, behold the works of Yahweh, Who has appointed desolations in the earth. 9 He makes wars to cease to the end of the earth; He breaks the bow and cuts up the spear; He burns the chariots with fire. 10 "Cease striving and know that I am God; I will be exalted among the nations, I will be exalted in the earth." 11 Yahweh of hosts is with us; The God of Jacob is our stronghold. Selah.

<u>Be still</u> – to stop, discontinue; to put an end to a state or an activity; drop it.

- a. Be still before the works of Yahweh—his sovereign rule over the earth.
- b. Be still and know this is the same mighty power by which he empowers our lives.
 - (Ephesians 1:19–20 NLT) I also pray that you will understand the incredible greatness of God's power for us who believe him. This is the same mighty power that raised Christ from the dead and seated him in the place of

honor at God's right hand in the heavenly realms.

- c. So cease the striving and anxiety in our hearts and know that Yahweh is God.
 - (Psalm 100:3 LSB) Know that Yahweh, He is God; It is He who has made us, and not we ourselves; We are His people and the sheep of His pasture.
 - (Philippians 4:6-7 NLT) <u>Don't worry about anything</u>; instead, pray about everything. Tell God what you need, and thank him for all he has done. 7 Then you will experience God's peace, which exceeds anything we can understand. His peace will guard your hearts and minds as you live in Christ Jesus.
- (Psalm 118:5–8 ESV) Out of my distress I called on the LORD; the LORD answered me and set me free. 6 The LORD is on my side; Iwill not fear. What can man do to me? 7 The LORD is on my side as my helper; I shall look in triumph on those who hate me. 8 It is better to take refuge in the LORD than to trust in man.

God is a safe place to hide, ready to help when we need him. We stand fearless at the cliff-edge of doom, courageous in sea-storm and earthquake, Before the rush and roar of oceans, the tremors that shift mountains. Jacob-wrestling God fights for us, God-of-Angel-Armies protects us.

(Psalm 46:1-3 The Message)
